



Fitting the brackets (not applicable for Click2Fit Roman Blinds)


The brackets offer two methods of installation:



If there is not enough space behind the headrail to hang the battery pack, then it can fixed to another surface using the 'clip' brackets provided. The clip brackets can be either top-fixed or face-fixed.

Fitting the blind (not applicable for Click2Fit Roman Blinds)





Hook the front lip of the headrail onto the front 'hook' of the bracket. Then push the rail against the bracket and raise the back up until the rear lip of the headrail snaps onto the rear hook of the bracket.








Fitting a Click2Fit Roman Blind



The fabric is attached to the front of the rail with Velcro. Peel the corner away from the end opposite to the controls, until you can access the tension lever under the rail.



Hold the blind in position at the top of the recess and push the lever firmly upwards until it locks into place in the underside of the rail.



Top Tip

Make sure that the tension lever is loose, and the pressure pad section is flush with the rail, before trying to place the blind inside the recess, otherwise it will be too wide to fit in initially.




Press the fabric back into place on the front of the rail to finish.



Child Safety

Safety cleat (not applicable for SmartView Roman Blinds)



The cord retaining device must be installed at the maximum distance possible from the control mechanism to prevent looped cords from becoming slack.

Place the retaining device on the wall and mark the position of the screw hole(s) with a pencil.

Attach the retaining device to the wall using the fixings provided.



Young children have died by wrapping loose curtain and blind cords or chain.


Secure cords or chains with cord guides or keep them out of reach by winding them around a cleat.

Move cots and furniture away from window covering cords or chains.

Do not remove this label.

WARNING: To avoid creating a possible strangulation hazard for children, the corded internal window covering must be installed in such a way that a loose cord cannot form a loop 220mm or longer at a height of less than 1600mm above floor level.

Cord retaining clips (applicable to all Roman Blinds)



The cords that raise and lower the fabric are attached to the back of the fabric using two-piece clips. These are a child-safety feature and are designed to separate if anything gets caught in the cords at the back.

These can also be easily unclipped if you need to detach the fabric, to take it to a dry cleaner for example.

SmartView Electric Roman Blinds





We recommend plugging in the motor to allow it to fully charge before use. Plug the charging cable (included) into the motor charging port (behind the fabric) and allow to charge until the LED on the charger plug turns green.



On the front of the swing tag that comes with your blind, you'll find a handy QR code you can scan with your phone. Scan this to download the SmartView app, and the app will guide you through the rest - you'll be setting up your blinds in moments!

Operating your blind (not applicable for SmartView Roman Blinds)





Top Tip

If you find at any point that the blind has fallen to one side, this is usually caused by a simple mix-up with the controls. To fix this, simply use the front of the chain to fully lower the blind, then continue pulling the chain until it raises to the top. The blind should even itself out as you do, and you can prevent the same issue recurring by making sure the chain is always pulled in the correct direction.

Pull down on the front part of the chain to lower the blind, and pull down on the rear part of the chain to raise the blind.


Taking the blind down

Click2Fit Blinds



Peel the fabric away from the rail to expose the lever. Using a screwdriver, gently pry the lever downward until you can fully loosen it - make sure you're holding the blind steady as you do this, and that your hand is not close to the lever.

Standard & SmartView Blinds



Push the rail back against the brackets and at the same time gently 'twist' the rail so that you're pulling the back of it downwards. This will unhook the rail from the rear hook on the bracket and allow you to remove the blind.
